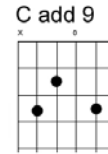


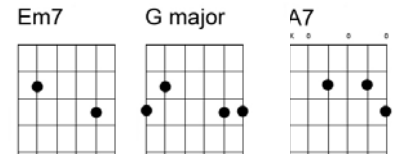
# NORWEGIAN WOOD

*Norwegian Wood (This Bird Has Flown)* is in 12/8 time (essentially 4/4 time where each beat is a triplet). The song was written by Lennon and McCartney—in the original, on the *Rubber Soul* album, a sitar was used. The drone of the 'D' on the second string, when used as a drone throughout the song, simulates the sitar.

Norwegian Wood refers to the floor boards of flats in Britain. After a night of failed romance ("Knowing She Would"), the would-be lover sets fire to the apartment before leaving.
